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POPULAR PYTHON LIBRARIES AND THEIR APPLICATION DOMAINS

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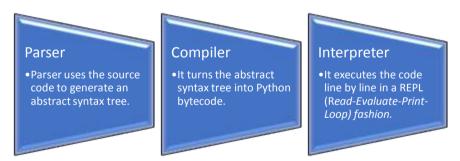

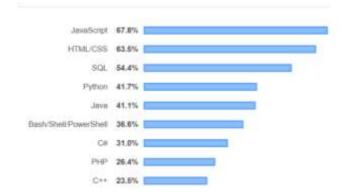


Figure 1:Most Popular Technology - 2019 [10]

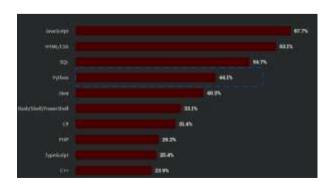


Figure 2:Most Popular Technology - 2020 [11]
